

#### **The Allied Victory Medal**

Also known as 'Wilfred'

It was decided that each of the allies should each issue their own bronze victory medal with a similar design, similar equivalent wording and identical ribbon.

The British medal was designed by W. McMillan. The front depicts a winged classical figure representing victory.

Approximately 5.7 million victory medals were issued. Interestingly, eligibility for this medal was more restrictive and not everyone who received the British War Medal ('Squeak') also received the Victory Medal ('Wilfred'). However, in general, all recipients of 'Wilfred' also received 'Squeak' and all recipients of 'Pip' also received both 'Squeak' and 'Wilfred'.

The recipient's service number, rank, name and unit was impressed on the rim.

#### The British War Medal 1914 - 1918

Established on 26<sup>th</sup> July 1919.

Also known as 'Squeak'.

The silver or bronze medal was awarded to officers and men of the British and Imperial Forces who either entered a theatre of war or entered service overseas between 5<sup>th</sup> August 1914 and 11<sup>th</sup> November 1918 inclusive. This was later extended to services in Russia, Siberia and some other areas in 1919 and 1920.

Approximately 6.5 million British War Medals were issued. Approximately 6.4 million of these were the silver versions of this medal. Around 110,000 of a bronze version were issued mainly to Chinese, Maltese and Indian Labour Corps. The front (obv or obverse) of the medal depicts the head of George V.

The recipient's service number, rank, name and unit was impressed on the rim.

#### The 1914 – 15 Star

Established in December 1918 Also known as '*Pip*'.

This bronze medal was authorized in 1918. It is very similar to the 1914 Star but it was issued to a much wider range of recipients. Broadly speaking it was awarded to all who served in any theatre of war against Germany between 5<sup>th</sup> August 1914 and 31<sup>st</sup> December 1915, except those eligible for the 1914 Star. Similarly, those who received the Africa General Service Medal or the Sudan 1910 Medal were not eligible for the award.

Like the 1914 Star, the 1914-15 Star was not awarded alone. The recipient had to have received the British War Medal and the Victory Medal. The reverse is plain with the recipient's service number, rank, name and unit impressed on it.

An estimated 2.4 million of these medals were issued.

#### **Corporal 439960 Stanley DODD**

No entry has been found on the "Soldiers Died in the Great War" CD-RoM as it is thought that due to Corporal Dodd's death occurring after the conclusion of hostilities, and at home, it was therefore not notified on the Regimental Casualty Lists from which the CD RoM is compiled.

The death occurred at Longton on Sunday of Mr. Stanley Dodd, (27), third son of Mr. and Mrs. Dodd, Bank House, Longton. Deceased, an ex-soldier, was "called-up" on August 5<sup>th</sup>, 1914, and served as a corporal in D Squadron of the Duke of Lancaster's Yeomanry all through the War, being seriously wounded early in 1918, when he lost the use of one of his hands. His health declined, and after being treated in various Army hospitals, was discharged from the Army in May of this year, and returned to his home in Longton. The funeral took place on Thursday at Longton Church with full military honours. The coffin was conveyed from the house to the Church on a gun carriage and six horses supplied by the Royal Field Artillery, Fulwood Barracks. The firing party consisted of N.C.O.'s and men of the Loyal North Lancashire Regiment who fired three volleys and the R.F.A. trumpeter sounded the "Last Post".

By the death of Corporal Stanley Dodd we lose another of our Longton soldiers. He joined the Duke of Lancaster's Yeomanry on 5<sup>th</sup> August, 1914, and so served all through the War. Later he transferred to the Royal Engineers, Last winter while on active service he contracted phthisis and after a long and trying illness he passed away on December 6<sup>th</sup> and was laid to rest in Longton Churchyard on the 11<sup>th</sup> with military honours. Our deepest sympathy is extended to Mr. and Mrs. Dodd and relatives.


