

Location Information: The village of Irchonwelz is located south-west of the town of Ath off the N7. From the motorway E42 turn off at junction 32 onto the N7 direction Ath. Follow the N7 past the villages of Gaurain-Ramecroix, Barry, Leuze-en-Hainaut and Ligne. After crossing the railway at Ligne take the first turning right to Villers-Saint-Amand, then the first turning left to Irchonwelz along rue Robert Delange. Take the first turning right off this road, cross the railway and the church is in front of you. The cemetery is near the church and the railway.

Historical Information: The 11 Commonwealth burials of the First World War in Irchonwelz Communal Cemetery all date from the final advance or the post-Armistice period. There is 1 unidentified burial of the Second World War here.



The medal Record Card for Private John PORTER

Preston Guardian Page 8 14th December, 1918

The death in action is officially reported of Pte. John Porter, Lancashire Fusiliers, who's home was at Mill Row, Walmer Bridge. An officer, writing to deceased's wife, says that on the afternoon of Nov. 10th, deceased regiment were advancing under a rather heavy bombardment, when a shell burst amongst them and killed Private Porter instantaneously. The letter concludes "He was a cheerful and good soldier, and will be sadly missed by all." Pte. Porter, who was 31 years of age, joined the Army in 1916 and had been in France about 15 months. Prior to enlisting he worked for Mr. Matthew Tomlinson at Hillock Farm, Wharton.

Extract of the 1901 Census for Longton, showing the Porter family living in Chapel Lane.



Amongst those named is Pte. John PORTER, though he was a resident of Mill Row, Walmer Bridge, Preston, he was employed by Matthew Tomlinson of Hillock Farm, Warton, (below) at the time of his enlistment.

He was killed in action on November 10th, 1918, the day before hostilities ceased.


