


Location Information: Gwalia Cemetery is located 8.5 kilometres west of Ieper town centre on the Steentjesmolenstraat (N333), a road leading from the Veurnseweg (N8) connecting Ieper to Elverdinge and on to Veurne. From Ieper town centre the Veurnseweg (N8) is reached via Elverdingsestraat, then turning right onto Haiglaan. Veurnseweg is a continuation of Haiglaan. 4 kilometres along the Veurnseweg (N8) in the village of Elverdinge, lies the left hand turning onto the N333 Steentjesmolenstraat. 4.5 kilometres along this road the cemetery will be located on the right hand side of the road.

Historical Information: The cemetery was opened at the beginning of July 1917, in the period between the Battle of Messines and the Third Battle of Ypres. It lay among the camps in flat, wet country and was used by infantry units, artillery and field ambulances until September, 1918. In Plot I, Row H, are buried 14 men of the 9th Lancashire Fusiliers who were killed in the early morning of 4 September 1917, in a German air raid over "Dirty Bucket Camp." The cemetery contains 467 Commonwealth burials of the First World War. The cemetery was designed by Sir Reginald Blomfield.



On undertaking the liability to serve abroad in time of national emergency, an officer or man of the Territorial Force will be required to sign an agreement, on Army Form E. 624, in the presence of the Officer Commanding the Territorial unit to which he belongs, and, unless notification to the contrary is given to the Commanding Officer, the liability will continue as long as the officer's or man's engagement in the Territorial Force lasts.

Medals awarded to Gunner 687252 John Richmond



The 1914 – 15 Star

Established in December 1918

Also known as 'Pip'.

This bronze medal was authorized in 1918. It is very similar to the 1914 Star but it was issued to a much wider range of recipients. Broadly speaking it was awarded to all who served in any theatre of war against Germany between 5th August 1914 and 31st December 1915, except those eligible for the 1914 Star. Similarly, those who received the Africa General Service Medal or the Sudan 1910 Medal were not eligible for the award.

Like the 1914 Star, the 1914-15 Star was not awarded alone. The recipient had to have received the British War Medal and the Victory Medal. The reverse is plain with the recipient's service number, rank, name and unit impressed on it.

An estimated 2.4 million of these medals were issued.



The British War Medal 1914 - 1918

Established on 26th July 1919.

Also known as 'Squeak'.

The silver or bronze medal was awarded to officers and men of the British and Imperial Forces who either entered a theatre of war or entered service overseas between 5th August 1914 and 11th November 1918 inclusive. This was later extended to services in Russia, Siberia and some other areas in 1919 and 1920.

Approximately 6.5 million British War Medals were issued.

Approximately 6.4 million of these were the silver versions of this medal. Around 110,000 of a bronze version were issued mainly to Chinese, Maltese and Indian Labour Corps. The front (obv or obverse) of the medal depicts the head of George V.

The recipient's service number, rank, name and unit was impressed on the rim.



The Allied Victory Medal

Also known as 'Wilfred'

It was decided that each of the allies should each issue their own bronze victory medal with a similar design, similar equivalent wording and identical ribbon.

The British medal was designed by W. McMillan. The front depicts a winged classical figure representing victory.

Approximately 5.7 million victory medals were issued. Interestingly, eligibility for this medal was more restrictive and not everyone who received the British War Medal ('Squeak') also received the Victory Medal ('Wilfred'). However, in general, all recipients of 'Wilfred' also received 'Squeak' and all recipients of 'Pip' also received both 'Squeak' and 'Wilfred'.

The recipient's service number, rank, name and unit was impressed on the rim.

Gunner 687252 John RICHMOND

John RICHMOND was born in Preston, the son of William (b. 1860 of India), a house painter, and Agnes Osbaldeston (b. 1861 of Preston). After schooling he took up employment as a coach painter.

His parents had been married at a "registrar's" wedding under the supervision of the Old Fylde Registry Office Blackpool in 1886 and were to have two other sons also born in Preston, William in 1891 and Robert in 1894.

John RICHMOND's mother Agnes was to die in 1894 and his father William was to marry again to Ellen GABBOTT (b. 1864 of Preston) at a Preston Registrar's wedding in 1901. They were to have a daughter Mary in 1904. Ellen was to die in 1925 and William in 1932, both in the Preston Registrar's district.

Subsequent to the First World War breaking out, **John Richmond** was to re-join the colours on 11th January, 1915, being posted as Gunner 687252 of the 2nd West Lancashire Division Royal Field Artillery. He had previously served for four years as Gunner 1969 with the same Unit.

It was noted in his papers that he was described as being of 6' 6½" in height and of average build.

On 22nd December, 1915, he embarked Southampton for Le Havre and his Unit was initially attached to the 36th (Ulster) Division but with other postings to follow.

He was admitted to hospital on two occasions with boils to the knees and with a subsequent head injury.

He was to die on the 5th August, 1915, in the care of the 134th Field Ambulance Unit from gunshot wounds to the legs and thighs.

He is buried at Gwalia Cemetery, Poperinghe, near Ieper, Belgium, in grave 1. G. 33.

He was awarded the 1915 Star, Allied Victory and British War medals.

Military records show that when John Richmond enlisted in 1915 he was residing at Pear Tree Cottage, Chapel Lane, Longton, and on 6th December, 1917, his mother Ellen was residing at 9, Poplar Avenue, Longton.

Previous family addresses had been 2, Holstein Street, (1891), 7 Sussex Street East, (1901), and 5 St. Ignatius Square, (1911), all being in Preston.
