CAUGHT BY TAXI.

**INQUEST ON NEW LONGTON
CHEMICAL MANUFACTURER.**

An inquest was held at Blackpool on Wednesday, on the body of Leo Rigby (35), chemical manufacturer, New Longton, near Preston, who died at the hospital on Tuesday as a result of a motor accident.—Mr. Cartmell represented the deceased's relatives, and Mr. Woosnam appeared for Arnold King Statter, taxi driver, Rydal-avenue.

Mrs. Rigby, the widow, said that about seven o'clock on Sunday she left her husband near the Tower, as he was going for a walk, and she was going to the Winter Gardens with her parents. When they returned to the Albion Hotel she was told her husband had been run over, and taken to the hospital, where she went, and remained with him until he died. The deceased was at the war for two years, and was slightly deaf in one ear when he had a cold. His eyesight was good.—Answering Mr. Cartmell, she said she had spent Sunday with her husband, and he did not appear to be deaf.

Harry Armstrong, joiner, 14, Egerton-road, Blackpool, said that at 8.45 on Sunday night he was standing under Woolworths' verandah on the Central Beach when he heard the sound of motor brakes being put on, and, looking, he saw a bowler hat rolling in the road and away from the rear of a car, under which was the deceased facing towards the sea. Witness assisted to get the deceased from under the car. When deceased was told he was being taken to the hospital he asked not to be taken there. Witness did not see the man knocked down. The car was pulled up in its own length. Witness thought there was a small car standing in front of the Royal Hotel. The night was dark and wet, and the road was greasy. The driver was quite sober, but excited over the accident.

Dr. Sheridan, house surgeon at the Victoria Hospital, said that when the deceased was admitted he was suffering from pains in the abdomen, injuries to the right leg, the right hip, and the right arm. His kidneys and pelvis were ruptured, and the pelvic bone was fractured. Deceased was conscious practically to the end, and the only explanation he gave of the accident was that he was knocked down by a taxi which ran over his stomach.

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Mrs. Rigby, recalled, was asked by Mr. Parker, the Deputy Coroner, if the deceased made any statement to her.

Mrs. Rigby said he told her it was a pure accident, as he could not see the approaching car from behind the stationary car, nor could the driver see him. He said he thought the driver of the car swerved slightly to go round by the Central Station.

Arnold King Statter, taxi driver, said that on Sunday night, at 8.45, he was driving a party of six from Wardleys, along the Carriage Drive, at a speed of eight miles an hour. As he approached the Royal Hotel he saw a car standing in front, but as there was no one about, owing to the rain, he did not sound his horn. As he approached the stationary car a man appeared between witness's head lights. He at once applied the brakes, as being the only thing he could do, the man being too near for witness to swerve. The deceased, who appeared to be crossing over to the promenade, was struck by the radiator. Witness pulled up in the car's length after he had set it lift. When they got the deceased from under the car, he asked where they were taking him, and when told to the hospital, he asked to be taken home.

The Deputy Coroner said he had come to the conclusion that the whole occurrence was the result of an accident. It was a thing that often happened when people came from behind another vehicle. The taxi driver had been extraordinarily straight as to what happened. There was no evidence that he had been negligent in any way, and no evidence calling for a different verdict than that of "Accidental death."
