#### The Allied Victory Medal

Also known as 'Wilfred'

It was decided that each of the allies should each issue their own bronze victory medal with a similar design, similar equivalent wording and identical ribbon.

The British medal was designed by W. McMillan. The front depicts a winged classical figure representing victory.

Approximately 5.7 million victory medals were issued. Interestingly, eligibility for this medal was more restrictive and not everyone who received the British War Medal ('Squeak') also received the Victory Medal ('Wilfred'). However, in general, all recipients of 'Wilfred' also received 'Squeak' and all recipients of 'Pip' also received both 'Squeak' and 'Wilfred'.

The recipient's service number, rank, name and unit was impressed on the rim.



#### The British War Medal 1914 - 1918

Established on 26<sup>th</sup> July 1919.

Also known as 'Squeak'.

The silver or bronze medal was awarded to officers and men of the British and Imperial Forces who either entered a theatre of war or entered service overseas between 5<sup>th</sup> August 1914 and 11<sup>th</sup> November 1918 inclusive. This was later extended to services in Russia, Siberia and some other areas in 1919 and 1920.

Approximately 6.5 million British War Medals were issued.

Approximately 6.4 million of these were the silver versions of this medal. Around 110,000 of a bronze version were issued mainly to Chinese, Maltese and Indian Labour Corps. The front (obv or obverse) of the medal depicts the head of George V.

The recipient's service number, rank, name and unit was impressed on the rim.



#### The 1914 – 15 Star

Established in December 1918

Also known as 'Pip'.

This bronze medal was authorized in 1918. It is very similar to the 1914 Star but it was issued to a much wider range of recipients. Broadly speaking it was awarded to all who served in any theatre of war against Germany between 5<sup>th</sup> August 1914 and 31<sup>st</sup> December 1915, except those eligible for the 1914 Star. Similarly, those who received the Africa General Service Medal or the Sudan 1910 Medal were not eligible for the award

Like the 1914 Star, the 1914-15 Star was not awarded alone. The recipient had to have received the British War Medal and the Victory Medal. The reverse is plain with the recipient's service number, rank, name and unit impressed on it.

An estimated 2.4 million of these medals were issued.

On Saturday, March 10th, the sad news reached us that Private Richard Wright has passed away after an operation in a hospital in Manchester. Richard Wright enlisted in the Kings Own Royal Lancaster Regiment during the first week of September, 1914. He was thus one of the first half-dozen who volunteered for Service. He was afterwards transferred to the Machine Gun Corps and went over to France in July, 1915. On October 22<sup>nd</sup> he was wounded at Thiepval, operated on at once, and a week later sent to Manchester and underwent several operations in various hospitals there, but succumbed to heart failure after the last. He is the thirteenth of our men to sacrifice his life on his country's behalf, and the only one to find a resting-place in our midst, and we are proud of his grave. His mother and sister have our deepest sympathy.
